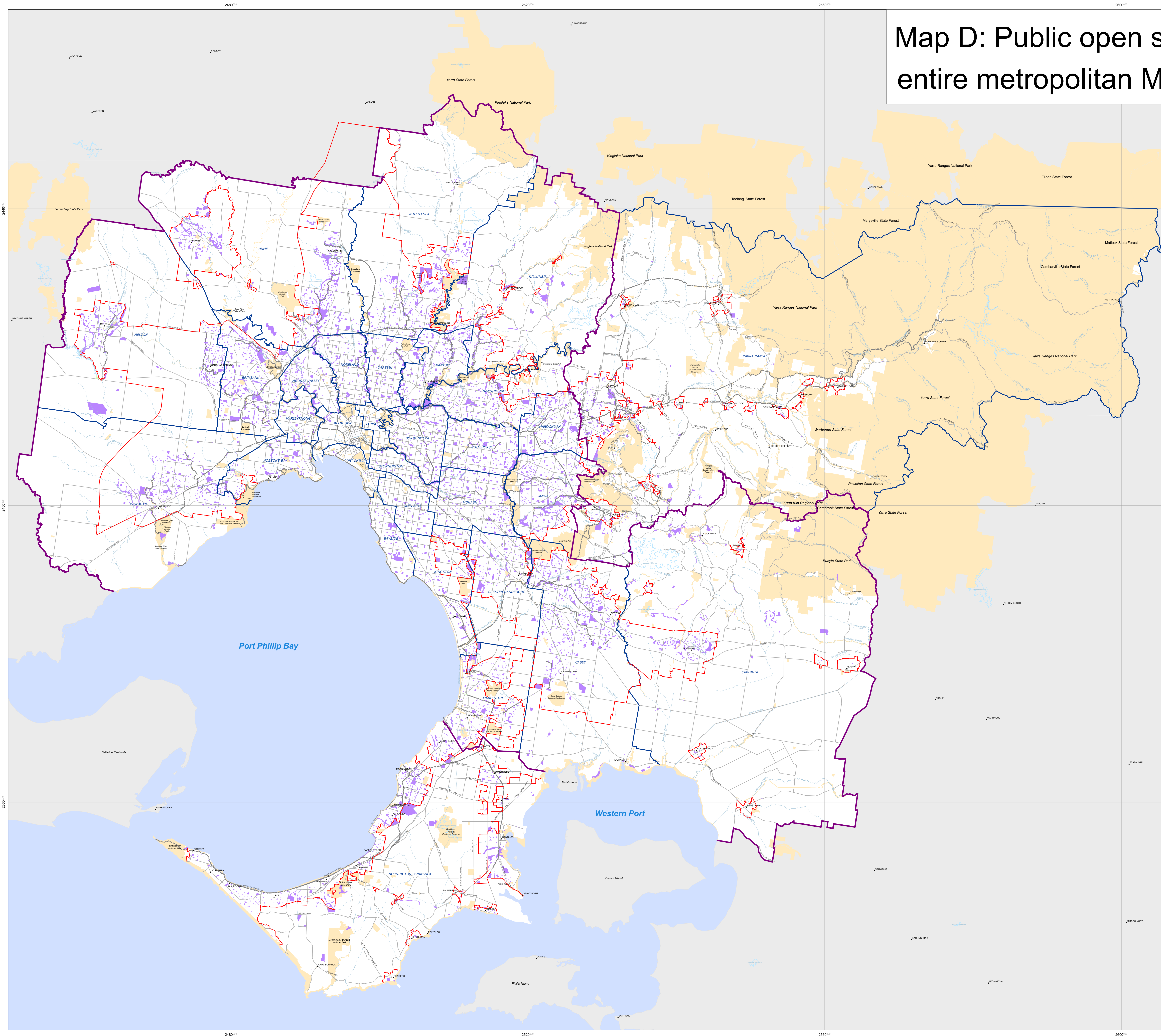


Map D: Public open space ownership in the entire metropolitan Melbourne area

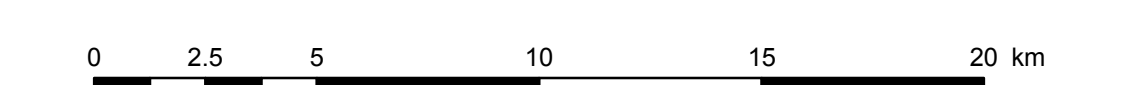


Notes:

1. This map is based on the VicMap Digital Crown land parcel data. Data for government freehold land was supplied by public authorities. Data for the metropolitan land network was supplied by Parks Victoria. Urban growth boundary data was supplied by the Department of Planning and Community Development. Various local councils provided a range of information about public open space on their freehold land. Larger areas of public land contiguous with the metropolitan area are shown for context.
2. Small land parcels (generally less than one hectare) may not be visible at this map scale.
3. Tourist railway lines shown on this map are active railway lines, not cycling and walking trails.
4. Some land identified as being owned public authorities is held in the name of the relevant minister, departmental secretary or governing body such as a council.
5. Municipal boundaries bordering Port Phillip Bay and Western Port are not shown as they would obscure coastal reserves.
6. The Shires of Mornington Peninsula and Yarra Ranges were not part of the Metropolitan Melbourne Investigation area. They are shown on this map for information only.
