**HISTORIC PLACES**

- Single place, Natinum (NA) 1:100 000 mapsheet, place 10.
- Multiple places, Hamilton (HA) 1:100 000 mapsheet, place numbers listed; indicates that those places are within or close to a township.

**NOTES**

1. The historic places are listed alphabetically by mapsheet then numerically by place numbers in the inventory - see Chapter 8.
2. Public land use is shown as recommended (see note 3), as reserved or as approved by government for the Corangamite, Wimmera, South-Western Area District 1 Reserve, South-Western Area District 2, and parts of the Ballarat and North Central Areas. For individual recommendation numbers and wording, refer to each of the published sets of recommendations.
3. The public land use categories shown are in accordance with the Council's new system published in its 1994 - 95 Annual Report. Nature conservation reserves include former flora reserves and flora and fauna reserves; natural features reserves include public land water frontages, streamlines, geological, bushland, lake and scenic reserves; community use areas include education areas and recreation reserves; State forest includes hardwood production, uncommitted land, forest area and ecotones of production areas; services and utilities include utilities and survey areas, and agricultural research stations; uncategorised public land includes township land and other reserves and public land; land not required for public purposes includes land recommended for allocation, generally for agriculture.
4. Wildlife reserves are under review by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. Those classified as not available for hunting will be considered nature conservation reserves; those wildlife reserves where hunting may be permitted will be considered natural features reserves. For the purpose of this map they are shown as natural features reserves.
5. Many recommendations are too small to be shown on this map. The portrayal of public land water frontages is indicative - refer to parish plans for details.
